We had 63 people at the event and we also asked a question

Taking into account the results seem and the options defined at a high level and supporting policies. Should a vote be held today would you vote?

Yes or No.

4 for No, 29 for Yes.

Comments have now been typed up and this one has been and it sums up all the work we have done and to continue to drive forward.

Based on the information gather. I feel that the plan must be in place and at every step of the way we have been asked our opinion which is the basis for the plan.

Would wish the Withington Parish council to continue with good communications with all residents. Fully support reduction in total number of homes and still consider option 1 to be best way forward.

While site 1 was the site of choice, people via the questionnaire also wanted no more than 10 houses building per site, so this now need to be investigated as a choice against maybe 30 on one site....

All the information from the March sessions covering sites, the results of the questionnaire have been added to the web site. The draft policies we are suggesting and options that have been developed out of the data received from the 7 open sessions we have now completed can also be found. Next we will be looking at the further development of objectives, options, policies, sites, vision, consultation statement and a statement, describing how we want your area to be in 15-20 years' time.

The aim is to share this with the steering over the next 6 weeks. Enabling a sharing with the council planning person we are working with in early March and also the full council at the March Meeting.
